



Kravis Faculty Summer Research Grant

The Kravis Leadership Institute is accepting applications from Claremont McKenna College faculty for summer research grants. These research grants are intended to foster cross-disciplinary research in leadership and to increase the involvement of CMC faculty in the Institute's activities and programs. The grants will provide up to \$5,000 for research in any area of leadership, broadly defined. Preference will be given to leadership research that best reflects the goals of the Kravis Leadership Institute, which are:

1. To provide a sound educational program of leadership studies for students at Claremont McKenna College.
2. To expand our knowledge and understanding of leadership and organizational effectiveness through research and scholarship.
3. To enhance the leadership capabilities of the larger community through a variety of outreach activities.

Applications

Applicants should submit a two to three-page proposal to Director, Ron Riggio, Faculty Support West, no later than **Friday, April 4, 2008**.

Selection

A committee made up of Director, Ronald E. Riggio, Associate Director, Susan E. Murphy, and at least one member of the Institute's Advisory Board will judge the proposals. The awards will be made in early **May, 2008**.

Requirements

It is expected that the research projects will be submitted for publication, and that the Kravis Leadership Institute will be acknowledged for its support. In addition, the recipients of the grants may be asked to give brief presentations of the project's results at our upcoming KLI Advisory Board meetings. Each candidate is further expected to commit to one of the following contractual obligations:

1. Submit a 200 word synopsis, plus author photo to be included in our newsletter (due August 15, 2008).
2. Submit a 500 word research report for publication in our newsletter (due September 15, 2008).
3. Submit a 15 page paper to our peer-reviewed online journal, Leadership Review (due November 15, 2008).
